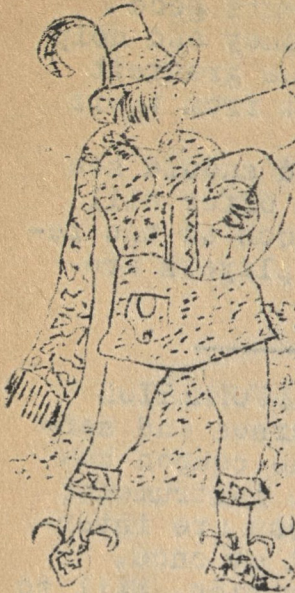

**PRACTICE IS NECESSARY TO BECOME
A GOOD DANCER.**

Like a pianist, singer, violinist, or other artist, the dancer must practice constantly in order to retain the technique gained.

In the well equipped studio large mirrors permit the student to see and correct their faults with the suggestions of the instructor. Bars firmly fixed to support the weight of a number of dancers gives opportunity for proper exercise. Three relaxed, soft arms which delight you on the stage are the result of hours of practice before the mirrors. To become a good dancer it is necessary to have a good teacher and the strength and ability to practice.
