PEIPING, October 23.—(Rengo)—In a recent address of the official diplomat, Mr. Saburi at Peiping was met with utter absence of a guard-honor of a hand to welcome him, though local Government and Kuomintang officials were present at the station. This is regarded as an indication of the mitigation felt in regard to the speech made by Mr. Saburi at Shanghai when he was alleged to have referred to China as though it were a vessel of Japan. This also resulted in the National Association for the Abolition of Unequal Treaties denouncing the National Government, who made representations to Tokyo that Mr. Saburi is a person non grata and request his recall.

TO GIVE PROTECTION AT COMING FESTIVALS

JERUSALEM, October 13.—(Trans)—Eminent measures have been taken by the Authorities in order to protect Jew and property during the forthcoming Jewish festivals.
